The AZ Dragon Riders recently competed in the Long Beach Dragon Boat Festival, which resumed for the 1st time post-Covid. The Riders faced fierce competition along with strong 10mph side winds to battle into the Division IIIA Final. The race was very close, with a solid surge to finish 2nd amongst 32 teams. We are very proud of the team's effort in achieving a Silver medal with one of the best finishes in our team's history. A funny thing is the medals and trophy are printed with 2020 with stickers on them for 2022! The Riders are entered into the San Diego International Dragon Boat Festival Race on September 25th. Since our March festival, The Dragon Riders have organically grown our team through word of mouth and introductions to new friends. We are developing a few experienced paddlers to coach in the future as we expand. The key is to keep training simple to make sure all team members are brought up to the same level. We strive to foster a fun team atmosphere with great sportsmanship & respect for others. We also had a great time at the AZDBA Open House, educating the public on our sport. We are excited to organize some community volunteer events such as Feed My Starving Children or participating in United Way's Food Bags for the Homeless closer to the Holidays.

Jin Hwan, one of the Riders' coaches, traveled to Sarasota, Florida, for the 13th International Dragon Boat Federation World Championships, July 13-22, 2022, as one of the race officials. Jin received the Grade 1 Certificate of Achievement for the IDBF Technical Race Official for completion of training and assessment. We are hopeful that we can represent AZDBA for the World Championship in Italy in 2024!

No one could imagine that Arizona could support a Dragon Boat team in the desert. The addition of Tempe Town Lake in 1999 provided a body of water perfect for water sports. Coaches Lana & Jeff Walther formed the AZ Dragon Riders in 2006, bringing like-minded people together. Both Lana & Jeff have a passion for giving back as they have served as Board members for AZDBA. Jeff has volunteered many hours in maintaining the Dragon Boats for practice and competition. They also volunteer annually to coach corporate teams for the AZDBA Festival. For the Gila's, 2022 marks our 20th anniversary as a team. While plans were made to go to Hawaii to commemorate the occasion, that festival was postponed due to the pandemic. So, this year's GWR Northern Nevada International Dragon Boat Festival in Sparks, NV, on the weekend of Aug 20th, was a very special event for the AZ Gila Dragons. This was the first festival we traveled to since the 2019 Portland Dragon Boat Festival. Fortunately, the Gilas are a resilient bunch. After AZDBA re-opened, the Gila's went right back to work on the water to make up for lost time. That hard work paid off at the Nevada festival. The Gilas took the overall Gold medal in the Grand Final of the Premiere Mixed A Division across an international field of teams from California, Nevada, Washington, Oregon, Alabama, and British Columbia, Canada. On top of that:

- They recorded the top-3 fastest 500m race times across all teams (including Open Division teams) across the entire festival.
- They bested the 2022 Open Division Finals Winner's time of 2:05.29.
- They were the overall #1 team in the Reno Festival.

The Gilas are off to an excellent start for their 20th anniversary year.

Looking back over 20 years has been a great source of motivation. The Gilas started after future members were invited to travel to Tempe's sister city of Taiwan to paddle in their festival. The group had no experience, no training, no equipment, and no knowledge. They didn't medal in that race, but they came back with grit, attitude, and determination. With no boats to use, they set up milk crates on the side of Tempe Town Lake and team members' swimming pools to get their practice. The Gilas started after the second trip out to Taiwan and had their inaugural race in San Francisco.

The Gila's have come a long way and are not done with the 2022 season. After a quick medal celebration, the Gila's are back in the water as they gear up next for the Mercer County Dragon Boat Festival in Princeton, NJ, on Sept 17th. From there, the Gilas will end the season at the San Diego Dragon Boat Festival, bringing a smaller contingency to fill a 10-paddler boat for a single day of racing on Sept 24th.

Given the challenges of Covid and the slow re-emergence of the Dragon Boat community and festivals around the nation, the Gila's knew that their 20th anniversary celebration year would be somewhat toned down. Even these challenges have not dampened the Gila's spirit of camaraderie on and off the water. Every Tuesday and Saturday, you will find the AZ Gila Dragons doing their thing out on the waters of Tempe Town Lake, getting ready for the next competition, and preparing for even a better 2023!
